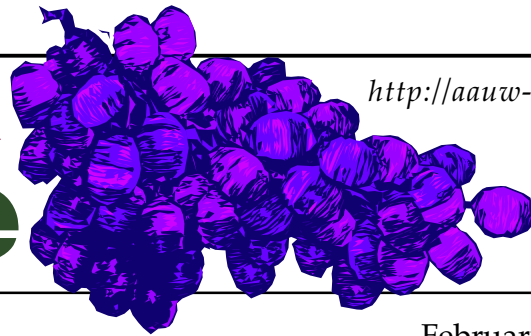

Meet the Branch Leadership Team

Louise Quenon (*VP Finance*) is a Bay Area native, born and raised in Berkeley where her father was a professor and her mother was a librarian. She earned her Bachelor's degree in Biological Sciences at Cal and a Master's in Zoology at Univ. Wisconsin. After teaching at Wisconsin State Univ. for a few years, the Bay Area beckoned and she returned taking a position teaching in the Biology Department at De Anza College – the first woman hired to teach in any of the STEM fields at De Anza.

A canoe trip in British Columbia provided the opportunity to meet her husband-to-be, Michel, a Belgian citizen. Over the years they have enjoyed many travels, often with a natural history or anthropological focus, such as kayaking Glacier Bay, Alaska, rafting the Colorado River through the Grand Canyon, on Safaris in East Africa and exploring the Sepik River of Papua New Guinea in a dugout canoe.

Often these trips yield ethnic folk art souvenirs that find a place in their home and as her then 6 year old niece once said, "[she] has funny things on [her] walls!"

At home Louise is usually found working in her garden, devising rodent-proof protections for the vegetable beds (*a work in progress!*), or in the kitchen utilizing the garden produce the rodents didn't eat. She loves cooking and baking in particular!

AAUW Los Gatos-Saratoga has been a part of Louise's life for 4 decades; while teaching, her involvement was mostly limited to playing in a bridge group but since retirement she has worked with Local Scholarships, Tech Trek, AAUW Funds (*formerly EF*), and for the past several years has coordinated the Bridge Interest Groups and organized the Games Party afternoons to benefit Tech Trek. She wholly supports the goals of AAUW and cherishes the many friendships she has made through the branch.



Los Gatos-Saratoga AAUW: The 1980s

The decade of the 1980's saw members visible in the community in various ways; for seven years the Saratoga Citizens of the Year were members of our Branch of AAUW: **Mildred Gordon** (1980), **Marge Bunyard** (1981), **Peggy Corr** (1983), **Willys and Betty Peck** (1985), **Marion Card** (1986), **Gladys Armstrong** (1987) and **Louise Cooper** (1989). Many members were elected to school boards and city councils or served on advisory committees and commissions.

Our Committee on Homeless Women and Children was probably the most active and visible group. **Georgia Travis** initiated the work in 1985 as a Women's Issue. By 1986 it was presented to Interbranch and became a county committee. In the spring of 1987 Georgia received the Santa Clara County Human Relations/Human Rights Award. She became a member of the Senior Hall of Fame of the Santa Clara County Fair Association for her work in research, organization and program development in addressing the problem of Homeless Women and Children.

At the California State Division of AAUW, eight Branch members served on the Group Effectiveness Training Team: **Margie Foote**, **Jean Foss**, **Mildred Gordon**, **Nancy Hobbs**, **Peggy Johnson**, **Jan Leyse**, **Phyllis Marangoni**, and **Mary Pastrone**. Fourteen members attended AAUW's 100th Anniversary convention in Boston and found the optional trips made this convention the most fun of any of the national meetings.



The Branch began co-sponsoring Expanding Your Horizons in Math and Science, a one-day workshop at San Jose State to help girls see the variety of options available within these fields and to encourage them to take math and science classes. This program continued for nearly two decades.

The Branch established a scholarship at West Valley College in memory of **Sammy Wishneff** to benefit reentry women. Later this was expanded to include all women pursuing degrees in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

Thanks to the efforts of **Nancy Hobbs**, the Interbranch Special Projects Foundation (ISPF) of Santa Clara County was incorporated as a Charitable Nonprofit Organization which allows donations for charitable projects within AAUW to be tax-deductible. Nancy served as ISPF president for many years, and **Jan Leyse** was the original treasurer. The first project reported through ISPF was our English Tea to benefit the Committee on Homeless Women and Children.

AAUW San Jose – Gifts for Teens Mission Accomplished Again

The final numbers are in—Gift for Teens provided 1,283 gift bags and 101 extra large gifts like sports balls, skateboards and board games to needy teens in the South Bay. Our gift bags continue to be seen as an incentive to bring teens into the Agencies where they can access help. With the increase in youth homelessness, the need for



the practical contents of the Gift for Teen bags is greater than ever. Due to a generous grant from the Shark Foundation in 2015, this year's bag also had a gift card for a pair of new shoes. From local high school clothing drives, to knitting clubs, to local businesses, to company donations, Gifts for Teens mobilized a generous community to help fill our bags with donated items. Joyce Sogg

June 28, 1937 – January 9, 2016
Resident of Los Gatos

Activist and community leader Joyce Sogg died Saturday, January 9, 2016 from complications of surgery. She was 78.

A resident of Los Gatos, Joyce practiced family law in San Jose for over 30 years. As a lifelong activist, she was fiercely passionate about humanitarian causes, including women's rights, civil rights, abortion and reproductive rights, and UNICEF. She was a National Representative for the National Organization for Women, and active in state and national politics. More recently, she volunteered for the Los Gatos Public Library, in elementary school literacy projects, and at the Women's Gathering Place, a day center for homeless women.

Joyce was born in Washington, DC. Raised primarily in Boston, she lived for three years as a young girl in Oahu, Hawaii where her father was an Army doctor. There, she was eyewitness to the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Joyce attended Radcliffe College, and later, Santa Clara University School of Law, one of only three women in her class. Joyce moved to the Bay Area in 1961. With her former husband, Richard Sogg, M.D., she raised two children, David and Carrie, and also delighted in her grandson, Stefan.

Known for her passion for the arts — visual arts, theatre, dance, and music — Joyce was highly valued as a volunteer at the City Lights Theatre and the San Jose Rep. An avid world traveler, she studied Chinese, and also played championship duplicate bridge (Life Master) and was a wicked-good knitter.

Joyce is also survived her sister, Karen Gahm, and brothers Norman Gahm and Randy Gahm.

Her friends, family, and colleagues will miss Joyce's passion, generosity, and humor. A memorial celebration of her life is being planned.

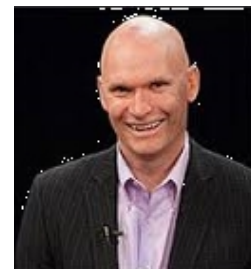

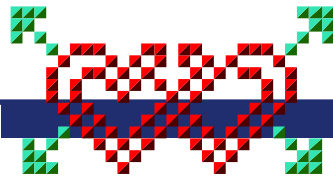
