




June 2015 – New Wilderness Open Space

In May our AAUW hikers and friends toured *Rancho San Vincente*, a new 1,000 acre wilderness open space preserve on the nearby, west side of the Almaden Valley. The site is not yet open to the public, but because several of our AAUW hikers have made contributions to *Peninsula Open Space Trust (POST)*, our reward was a guided tour of this beautiful hillside land.

We climbed up the gravel road, surrounded by wild flowers, a few cows, and through a very rocky, grassy landscape, to the top of the hill with a fabulous view of Calero Reservoir and the valley below. Named Gift Honoree 2015



This year's honoree grew up and attended public school in San Francisco's Marina District. When she entered middle school, she came down with polio and spent 6 months in the hospital. She had painful physical therapy to stretch and strengthen her muscles.

She became an art major at Oakland College of the Arts. She earned elementary, secondary and college teaching credentials. After graduating she worked at a publishing company. She and her English husband, John, met at a cricket match and have been a team ever since. They have a son.

She was a Palo Alto **AAUW** member for 30 years, serving as a board member, president, and vice president. She and another member learned word processing and desk-top publishing to make the newsletter *The Key* more attractive and received an award from **AAUW-CA**.

When she moved to the *Saratoga-Retirement Community (SRC)* our honoree joined the Los Gatos-Saratoga **AAUW**.

After moving to the *SRC*, the director hearing of her past library experience asked her to organize a *SRC* library with the books the new residents had donated—a *daunting task*. The books were stacked floor to ceiling. Recruiting teams of residents to sort the books, they had the books shelved and duplicates donated to *Saratoga Friends of the Library* in just two weeks.

She has been active in our *Great Decisions Programs*, starting two groups at the *SRC* and working with Anne and Al Stewart in ordering the materials for our large group at the *SRC*. She and John both volunteer at Rosemary Middle School and have worked for 9 years on theater productions at West Valley College – she has acted, sung in the chorus, written scripts, and directed plays. In her spare time she knits and donates her work to *Project Linus*.


