

## Meet the Branch Leadership Team

**Nancy Anderson.** I was born in 1932 in a mining camp in Western Australia. At age four we moved to Perth. The impending WWII caused a move near my mother's parents in Vancouver, Canada. The cold winter sent us to Alhambra (*near Los Angeles*). Next it was off to the mining camp in Fresno, Zacatecas, and four years later to a new position in Mexico City. In 1947 we returned to Alhambra, California where I finished high school. In 1950 I began the pre-nursing course at the USC, but like an idiot I left to be married. We lived in Manhattan Beach until 1957 when my husband's employer, Lockheed, opened a new plant in "The Valley of Heart's Delight".


In 1961 I heard that the County Council of Churches needed volunteers for their Migrant Ministry program. I was assigned four Saratoga orchards to check if the children had their shots and took families to the clinic the county ran in Almaden valley. With the Federated Church we ran a program where Redwood students would tutor the young children. Thanks to the school district, I collected out-of-date text books and had a lending library in the back of my station wagon. I continued this for 15 years until the orchards were pretty much gone.

In 1963 I finished to college with a degree in Anthropology. I continued in the Mexican-American Graduate Studies Department finishing all the class work and intern hours when my husband and I divorced and I had to go to work.

I worked as a social worker in 1974 and then the County decided they needed more workers with a master's degree so 13 of us signed up and with the County paying our full salary received our MSW. (*Those were the days when we had money and had the name, Santa Claus County!*)

In 1982 I married Doug and after he retired from Lockheed. I couldn't see why I should keep working! I retired and we started traveling. We bought a pop-up trailer and toddled all over the U.S plus taking trips abroad and a wonderful trip to Australia.

In 1986 Georgia Travis decided I should work with homeless women and children so I joined that nascent committee in the Los Gatos-Saratoga AAUW, I am now its Chair. I also enjoyed working with the city of Saratoga, serving on the Historic Preservation Commission and the Saratoga Historical Foundation. My favorite task there was to dress up in my long skirt and apron and stand in the kitchen of the McWilliams house and describe to the many classes of children that come to hear about life in 1860 (*Linda Hagelin's program*).

For these efforts I was surprised and honored to be selected as the 2008 Saratoga Citizen of the Year.

Today at 84 and Doug at 96 we are mostly at home. I have three daughters and between us, Doug and I have 7 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren. I host the Spanish Conversation group in my home, come join us, it's fun!

I'll always be grateful to AAUW, I have made some wonderful friends and have had the privilege of interacting with smart, interesting and entertaining women. *Who could ask for any more?*

## Our Branch's Highest Honor Given to This Year's Named Gift Honoree

Our branch each year honor members and supporters for their contribution to the mission of AAUW, whether through financial support, their service as branch leaders or staunch supporters of AAUW.

Today we honor two members who have many common interests as you will find out later.

The first honoree love roses. She has over 80 rose bushes in her yard! If I had a choice to name a rose after this honoree, I would call it the Compassionate Rose. This honoree has been actively involved at the Women's Gathering Place serving on their advisory board and helping with lunches. She not only helps with the Homeless Committee by serving lunches on the last Wednesday of the month, but every week she leads in bagging 160 bag lunches. Here are a couple of stories from Pastor Sharon Hare of the First Presbyterian Church: "One day a sick woman came to the Women's Gathering Place. Our honoree felt compassion for her and allowed her to lie down in one of the rooms. Then she helped with the lunches. Our honoree didn't think that others would be exposed to the sick woman's germs." Another compassion example was when she took Izzy out on an outing. (You remember Izzy who was one of our speakers at the Pearl Tea). Izzy responded very positively about the outing, (our honoree learned that she needed to get permission first). How wonderful is that compassionate spirit.

Our honoree chaired this year's Author's Lunch. She has helped with the new members' orientation, attended book group, played bridge, and participated in the gourmet lunch. When Joyce Sogg passed away, our honoree filled in to coordinate the Homeless Committee lunch program. I helped served lunch one day and bought a cake. This honoree made ham, potatoes, vegetables and salad for the WPG clients. She has devoted a big part of her life in supporting those who need help. I am delighted to announce one of this year's Named Gift Honoree—**Judy Borlase**.

This is a Native American poem, author unknown. But to me, it symbolizes our second Named Gift Honoree. She joined the Homeless Committee and was instrumental in the committee helping the Women's Gathering Place. Like the first honoree, she served on the advisory board. I helped serve lunch there on several occasions with the honoree. As part of the process Pastor Sharon Hare would have the clients form a circle for prayer. The honoree would disappear. At the time I did not know that she was an atheist. Over a period of time, Pastor Sharon and she became good friends. Pastor Sharon told me that one day the honoree told Pastor Sharon that she was the only atheist friend, but the Pastor said no, that she had other friends who were atheist. Immediately, our honoree responded by saying "Well, you are the first Pastor friend I ever had."



Unfortunately, our honoree passed away on January 9, 2016, and you read about her in the *February and the April 2016 Grapevine* issues. Those of us who attended her memorial service on April 30<sup>th</sup> were treated to her musically talented family. We asked to select a few items from a table that containing the honoree's books, pins, jewelry and other items. The second Named Gift Honoree for this year is **Joyce Sogg**.
