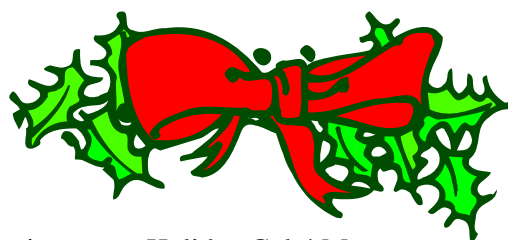

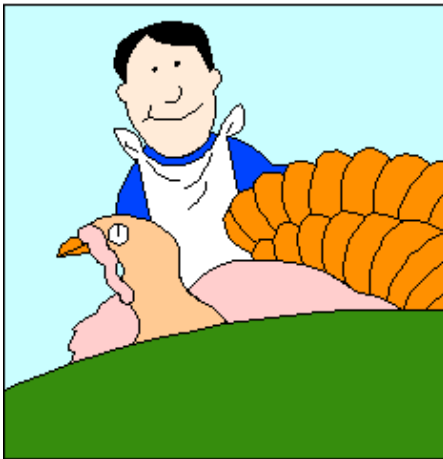

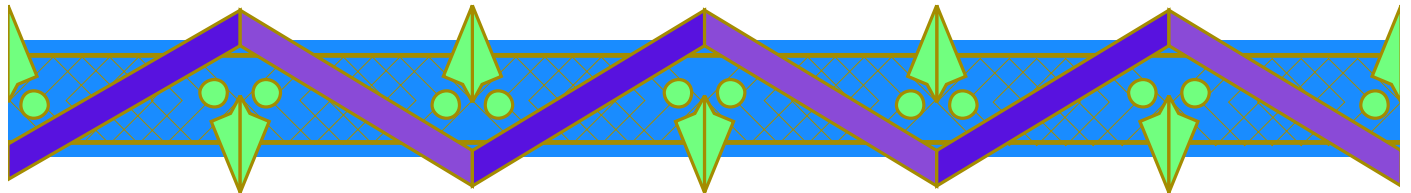

### Phyllis Marangoni

Phyllis Ella Garver Marangoni, 87, passed away of bone marrow cancer at the Los Gatos Meadows on Friday, September 26, 2014.

Born in Hiram, Ohio, she referred to her “small town” upbringing with gratitude. Phyllis graduated from Hiram College and completed two years of graduate work at Kent State in Ohio. Phyllis was one of five children; her sole surviving sibling, Sally Flick, was with her when she died.

Phyllis was married on December 27, 1948 to Louis Dominic Marangoni. She is survived by their four children, Eugene Garver Marangoni (Frank McNamara), James Ray Marangoni (Lisa), Anne Louise Marangoni (David Simonsen) and Maura Leigh Marangoni (John Norris) and five grandchildren.

In Cleveland, she found special joy in teaching. After the birth of her first child she left teaching to become even more active in community affairs. Phyllis served as a PTA president at Lynbrook High School and as a state vice-president of the AAUW. Phyllis was the Los



Gatos-Saratoga branch president 1974-75. She volunteered with the League of Women Voters, the Saratoga Book-Go-Round and Hakone Gardens. Phyllis had a keen interest in handwriting analysis. Phyllis was a member of the Unitarian Universalists, first in Palo Alto, then in Sunnyvale and Los Gatos. She particularly enjoyed PBS, reading and playing bridge. She was a devoted Giants fan. She is remembered as having a great sense of humor, loving people and giving warm hugs.

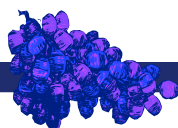
